April 8 - Total Solar Eclipse

**April 22 &23 – Lyrids Meteor Shower.** The best viewing will be after midnight with meteors radiating from the constellation Lyra.

**April 23- Full Growing Moon**. Native Americans recognized that this was the time of year when plants would begin wake up.
